Calculating Jefferson Parish Property Taxes

The first \$75,000 of value on a primary residence is exempt from parish taxes, if the property is Homestead Exempt. For example, if the assessed value is \$125,000, the parish millage would apply to \$50,000 (\$125,000 - \$75,000) . The result is divided by 10 for a taxable value of \$5,000 (\$50,000 x .1). For example, in Gretna City the Parish millage of 0.06338 X \$5,000 non-exempt value results in a parish tax of \$316.90.

Next, City taxes must be added. The homestead exemption does not usually apply to the city portion. For example, the Gretna City millage would apply to theentire value of \$125,000. Multiplying the City millage of .05113 x \$12,500 gives an additional City tax of \$639.13.

In Kenner, the Homestead Exemption applies to the city portion. The Kenner City millage applies only to the non-exempt value of the property. So the additional Kenner millage would be $$5,000 \times 0.02393 = 119.65 . Total property taxes for a home in Kenner with a value of \$125,000 would be \$329.75 (Jefferson Parish tax) + \$119.65 (Kenner tax) = \$449.40.
